Electricians union invites Glenn to speak at dinner

John Glenn, candidate for the Democratic nomination to the U.S. Senate, may be chipping away at the support Sen. Howard Metzenbaum commands in labor circles.

Glenn will be the main speaker tomorrow night at an awards dinner of Electrical Workers Union Local 38

— representing 1600 construction electricians in Greater Cleveland.

Asked if Glenn's appearance could be interpreted as an informal endorsement of the former astronaut, Richard Acton, business manager of the local, declined comment.

Acton, it is known, has been close to Glenn since the time both of them

served on Governor Gilligan's environmental task force.

Acton said that his local traditionally does not make endorsements in the primary elections.

Metzenbaum, Acton said, has been invited to speak at the local's membership meeting next month in the Local 38 union hall at 1590 E. 29d St.
